American Community Survey Supplement Atlanta Area Housing Characteristics **Fulton County**



This month, the **Spelman College Census Information Center** produced the first supplement in a series of newsletters highlighting some of the census data from the **American Community Survey (ACS)**. The highlighted topics will include trends in housing patterns, business ownership, educational attainment, health quality, and financial characteristics of the metropolitan Atlanta area. December's newsletter focuses on data from ACS about housing and financial characteristics within Fulton County.

Atlanta is the principal city of the Atlanta metropolitan area, and is located within Fulton County. The data discussed in this newsletter indicate that there are approximately **348,350 occupied housing units in Fulton County, with 51% being owned by whites, and 41% being owned by blacks.** The majority (69%) of homes are owned by individuals over 35 years of age. **Many of the homeowners (47%) have a bachelor's degree or higher and the median monthly housing cost is \$1,079.**

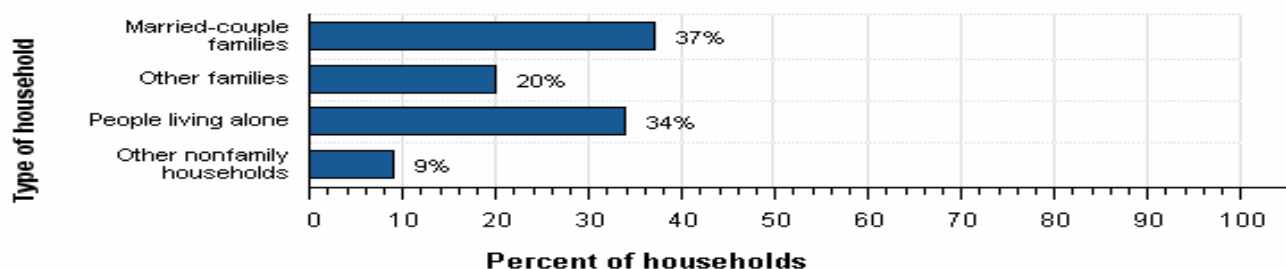
