

Application for Bush-Hewlett Faculty Fellow

Description:

These awards—distributed between January, 2003 and December, 2005 provide funding for individual or group applications (2-3 faculty or other primary investigators) for using the Internet for research, publication of student and faculty material, and exchange of information among groups on campus or in the wider community. For 2003-4 and 2004-5, each group project lasts for two semesters and includes a final presentation of the project to faculty peers. The last semester of Fellows will be scheduled for one semester.

The group activity should have a clear relationship to a teaching/learning environment and should enhance student learning. A schedule of assessment of student learning and faculty experiences will accompany the group activity.

The material created for posting on the Internet--and used for delivery of information or a site of academic discussion--may be creative written, audio, or visual material or analytical or research production (all with the full intellectual ownership of the student/faculty posting the material).

Terms of the Award:

- ✓ *An 8-day August workshop to develop skills appropriate to the proposed project (\$1000)*
- ✓ *A student assistant assigned to each faculty member to support technical activities*
- ✓ *Technical support from Dan Bascelli*
- ✓ *Editorial/composition support from Anne Warner and the Peer Tutor Staff in CWP*
- ✓ *Award of \$600 for final project presentation to faculty peers.*
- ✓ *One-course release time support available: \$2,500 to remunerate a part-time replacement instructor. The arrangement for release time must be negotiated and cleared through the chairperson of the department.*

Project selection:

Proposals will be reviewed by the Faculty Development Committee, in cooperation with the project director and coordinator.
