The Georgia Alcohol Policy Partnership is looking for 4 students to participate in two internship programs that will provide valuable experience with a modest stipend. **Fall Internships will run from September 15 to November 28, 2003, and spring internships from January 19, 2004 to March 26, 2004**

GAPP will allow two full-time students in the state of Georgia, **majoring in Graphic Arts, Graphic Design** or related course work to provide artistic support to their Strategic Partnership Management Team. The course prerequisites for this program include graphic design and marketing projects dealing with public health, government or public administrative media advocacy campaigns. This program will require a **12 - week commitment and will award 3-12 hours of course credit** to students enrolled at an accredited four-year college or university. **The minimum acceptable GPA is 2.50.** All interested parties are instructed to submit a one-page letter of interest, a resume, 3 visual samples and any necessary performance review materials required by the academic department for establishing a student's participation in the host college or university's internship curriculum by mail to **Marcia. GAPP is currently establishing an internship program that will allow two full-time students in the state of Georgia, majoring in Political Science, Urban Studies or Sociology, to provide administrative, project support, and meeting planning support to GAPP's Strategic Partnership Management Team. The course prerequisites for this program include concentrated study of public health with supplemental legislative, political science, or public administrative study. However, each applicant will have the opportunity to substitute relevant course work. The intern will also need to supply his/her own transportation to meet the Management Team at various locations. This program will require a **12 -week, minimum 10 hours per week commitment and will award 3 to 12 hours of course credit.** Students who wish to participate in the full academic year may only receive 3 hours course credit per semester. **The minimum acceptable GPA is 2.50.** All interested parties are instructed to submit a one-page letter of interest, a resume, and any necessary performance review materials required by the academic department for establishing a student's participation in the host college or university's internship curriculum by mail to **Marcia E.
