





# Clinical Nurse Leader Masters of Science in Nursing

### Launch your nursing career at Augusta University

The Clinical Nurse Leader (CNL), Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree program is an innovative master's-entry accelerated graduate program for individuals with non-nursing bachelor's degrees. The CNL graduate is an advanced generalist (not an Advanced Practice RN).

CNL students can complete this degree program in 16 months and enter the nursing profession by translating the skills and experiences from their education to launch their careers in nursing.

Graduates of this program are eligible to take the NCLEX licensure examination for Registered Nurses and the CNL Certification exam offered by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. CNL graduates are highly recruited by major health systems.

The Clinical Nurse Leader (CNL) is a masters-educated advanced generalist nurse, prepared for practice across the continuum of care within any healthcare setting. The CNL was developed by AACN in collaboration with leaders from healthcare practice and education to address the critical need to improve the quality of patient care outcomes. The CNL is a clinical leader who focuses on:
