Like Carrie Mae Weems, Weatherspoon's gift of a camera gave her purpose and direction. Based in Atlanta and Birmingham, her work spans editorial and commercial photography, using both stills and filmmaking to tell powerful stories. Her work has been featured in The New York Times, NPR, ESPN, and more.

Weatherspoon captures history in real time, documenting significant moments such as the Equal Justice Institute's Bryan Stevenson and the National Memorial for Peace and Justice. Her subjects range from demonstrators to the majesty of Mardi Gras, highlighting heritage and humanity. Exhibited at The African American Museum in Philadelphia and Photoville NYC, Weatherspoon is an awardee of The Lit List (2018) and a Canon Explorer of Light (2020). She is affiliated with Diversify Photo, Authority Collective, Women Photograph, and more.
