AVA FLANIGAN

CLASS OF 2027

A powerhouse in robotics and tech, Ava has mastered the art of the pivot, interning at NVIDIA and Cisco while researching quantum computing and game dev. As AUC NSBE President, she's opening doors for the next wave of STEM leaders.

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"During my time at Spelman, I have interned at NVIDIA as a Systems Software Robotics Intern (Summer 2024), and Cisco Systems as a Technical Product Intern (Summer 2025). I am also a IBM-HBCU Quantum Center Undergraduate Research Fellow, and a Game Development Research Fellow through the Spelman Innovation Lab. I am also a MLT Career Prep Fellow and a former MLT Ascend Fellow."

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

"I've had multiple travel experiences during my college career, including the National Society of Black Engineers National Convention (Atlanta and Chicago), the DE Shaw Connect Event (New York), the RSM Excellence Academy (Chicago), and McKinsey & Company's HBCU and HSI First-Year Immersion Experience (Atlanta). Each experience exposed me to networking opportunities with company leads, mentorship, and interview and internship opportunities at the companies."



What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"So far, my most intentional career-prep move has been networking with recruiters and decision-makers to secure internship opportunities. Always form relationships from a place of intention, sincerity, and genuineness, but also make sure you communicate your needs to those you form bonds with. In today's day and age, it is nearly impossible to land a job without knowing someone within the company you are interested in joining, so try to reach someone who can advocate for you. When you do land a career opportunity/internship, make sure to network with as many people as you can while you are there so that you have numerous people advocating for you to get a return offer!"

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

"Through my various commitments on campus, I have been able to ring the common theme of igniting an interest in STEM for K through 12 students from marginalized backgrounds. One of my life goals is to increase the number of minorities in STEM spaces, and I have been able to get the ball rolling through my roles as Co-Captain for SpelBots and President of AUC NSBE. I know that the future will hold space for Black, female, and low-income voices in STEM as I watch the excitement for engineering and robotics in young students today."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"For those preparing for career success, I recommend taking every opportunity to network and meet people in the field you are interested in. Although it may sound cliché, the phrase "your network is your net worth" rings true, and those words can guide you into a successful career. Also, do not be afraid to ask for what you want because people are more likely to say yes than you may think."





A two-time EA producer intern and Schwarzman Scholar, Ava bridges the gap between gaming and global affairs. From the Innovation Lab to NYU Shanghai, she's proof that starting early and planning ahead opens doors worldwide.

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"I have participated in the U.S. Bank Wall Street Fellowship and the JPMorgan Chase & Co. Sadie Summit Collective Program. Additionally, I had the opportunity to be a producer intern at Electronic Arts for two summers in 2024 and 2025, working on AAA game titles. For post-grad, I have been accepted into the Schwarzman Scholars program to receive a fully-funded MA in Global Affairs at Tsinghua University."

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

"I had the opportunity to attend Deutsche Bank's HBCU Leadership Summit, where I was able to gain insight into entry-level roles within investment banking. I also participated in the HBCU Taiwan Study Tour, where I broadened my global perspective on economic policy, which later inspired me to study abroad at NYU Shanghai for a semester."

What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"Starting early was the most intentional career move I made throughout my matriculation at Spelman College. Beginning Freshman year, I actively developed my resume, interview skills, and elevator pitch through the Career Planning and Development center to position myself as a competitive internship candidate."

What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"I am a firm believer in giving back to the community that poured into you, and one way I do that is through being the Director of the Gameplay Club at the Spelman Innovation Lab. After my time as an Electronic Arts intern working on AAA game titles, I wanted to pass that information down to young game developers on campus."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"Define your goals early and develop a four-year plan with tangible milestones. Make sure to leverage campus resources, seek mentorship within Spelman programs, and remain consistent and proactive as soon as possible. Periodically check back on that four year plan to outline the measurable steps you have taken, and hold yourself accountable so that you can be secure in your post-grad plans."





CAYLA MORGAN

CLASS OF 2026

From NASCAR to the Falcons and Hawks, Cayla is a force in sports marketing. As the first female President of the Morehouse Sports Business Association, she’s “watering her own seed” to ensure a harvest of success for women in sports.

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

“I have participated in the NASCAR Next Internship as the Programming Intern for the NASCAR Foundation, HBCU Fellowship Atlanta Falcons as the Brand Marketing Intern, HBCU Pathways Atlanta Hawks as the Digital Marketing Intern, the Morehouse College Sports Business Conference as the Co-Sponsorship Chair, and co-hort member MLB on Deck Sales Program.”

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

“Through the Atlanta Falcons HBCU Fellowship Program, I had the opportunity to attend the Sports Power Brunch during Super Bowl Week in New Orleans. As part of the cohort, we were placed in a room full of women leading across the sports and entertainment industries. It was powerful to witness women thriving in the very roles we aspire to pursue. The experience expanded my network, strengthened my confidence, and reinforced what’s possible when you’re exposed to excellence.”

What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

“I’ve intentionally positioned myself to never be boxed into one role. By being multifaceted in every position I’ve held, I’ve developed a broad skill set and a well-rounded understanding of the industry I want to pursue.”

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

“I’m shaping tomorrow through leadership by becoming the first female President of the Morehouse College Sports Business Association, opening doors for more women to pursue roles in sports business and redefining who belongs in those spaces”

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

“Take every opportunity to grow yourself! No seed grows without being watered by different experiences. Step outside your comfort zone make sure you apply for the internship, attend the networking event, and be impactful. Every experience adds to who you’re becoming. Water yourself consistently, and trust that the harvest will come.”





MARIAH HICKS

CLASS OF 2028

Mariah explores the nexus of finance and data through elite programs like AltFinance and JPMorgan. As founder of Women on Wall Street at Spelman, she's building a community for Black women to lead in finance and "take up space".

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"Through internships, I have been able to explore the intersection of finance, technology, and data in solving real-world problems."

"I have also gained exposure to the financial services industry through programs and site visits including the AltFinance Wharton Workshop, JPMorgan Markets Insight Program, Bank of America Campus Insight Forum, Bloomberg Decoded: Data at Bloomberg, BNY Emerging Talent Summit, Truist x TCMF Innovation Competition, the Cambridge Associates InvestX Program, the Black Women in Asset Management Conference, and the Cornerstone Research BRIDGE Program."

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

"Beyond my own professional development, I founded Women on Wall Street at Spelman to create a community where young Black women can learn about careers in finance, build technical skills, and support one another as we pursue opportunities in the financial services industry."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"My advice to my sisters is to remember that you belong in every room that welcomes you. Show up confidently, ask thoughtful questions, and take up the opportunities that were meant for you"



Launch@Apple

Virtual Mentorship Program with Paid Summer Work Experience

Launch@Apple is designed for first-generation college students who are interested in Corporate Finance. Students will develop professional and technical skills through weekly online workshops, be provided with guidance and support from an Apple mentor, and gain hands-on work experience through a full-time, 5-week paid work experience during the Summer of 2027.

Eligibility

- ✓ Undergrad graduation date of December 2028 or Spring 2029
- ✓ Majoring in: finance, economics, accounting, or a similar discipline relating to business, mathematics, commerce, or data analytics
- ✓ Parent(s) / guardian(s) have not obtained a college degree

Program Details

- ✓ Begins January 2027
- ✓ Weekly one-hour virtual cohort sessions: *January - April, Fridays @ 1pm PT*
- ✓ Weekly 30-minute virtual mentoring: *Timing to be determined with mentor*
- ✓ Virtual Summer paid work experience: *July 12 - August 13, 2027*





RACHEL PETERSON

CLASS OF 2028

From Napa to EY-Parthenon, Rachel's path is global. A Georgetown Security Fellow, she credits Study Abroad and Domestic Exchange for her growth. Now Chicago-bound, she mentors others to refine their resumes and build deep faculty bonds.

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"I have participated in three internships during my time at Spelman. I interned with a tech startup in Napa, California, and completed two internships with EY-Parthenon, a consulting firm, in their San Francisco Office. Those last internships led to a full-time return offer from EY-Parthenon in their Chicago office, which I accepted."

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

"I was selected for the Georgetown HBCU Security Studies Program, which I completed during the summer of my Sophomore year, and traveled to Georgetown's campus in Washington, DC, where I was able to visit government agencies, such as the NSA or CISA, and Capitol Hill. I learned more about the field of security studies and the plethora of career opportunities it offers. During my junior year, while on Domestic Exchange, I was invited to attend the Council on Foreign Relations' Conference on Expanding Access to International Affairs, a 2-day event in New York City that emphasized the need for diverse perspectives in international policy and featured many panels on the United States and foreign policy."

What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"My most intentional career-prep move so far has been working on and refining my resume to showcase my abilities in a concise way. Through this work, recruiters have been quite interested in my story and collegiate progression, which has led them to want to get to know me as a person and has given me the opportunity to present myself as a strong candidate for any position. "

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

"I am shaping tomorrow through leadership and impact by making sure I share resources, opportunities, and experiences with my fellow Spelman students so they can make the most of their college experience, as I have. Without experiences like Domestic Exchange or Study Abroad, I would not have learned as much as I have or interacted with the right people who have made fundamental imprints on my career and personal life. I believe that serving as a mentor to students just starting their college journey ensures that tomorrow is filled with those who take chances and give back to the community when they can."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"My advice would be to build intentional, meaningful relationships with faculty and staff on campus. Many of the wonderful teachers and mentors I have had at Spelman have been crucial in my journey at this school and have made lasting impressions that I will continue to reflect on even after graduation. Your network should be one of the most important takeaways from one's time at Spelman."





REESE WINSTON

CLASS OF 2026

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"I've had the opportunity to intern at Unity as a VR Developer, where I built immersive environments and optimized system performance. I also worked at Google as an AI/ML researcher on the Gemini team, focusing on improving the inclusivity of natural language processing systems. Most recently, I served as a Technical Project Manager Intern at Verizon, leading cross-functional initiatives and building internal tools to enhance engineering operations. These experiences have allowed me to bridge technical depth with leadership and measurable impact."

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

"Throughout my time at Spelman, I've participated in multiple hackathons, collaborating with diverse teams to build technical solutions under pressure and strengthen my problem-solving skills. During my internship at Verizon, I visited active cell tower sites to see firsthand the infrastructure that powers national connectivity and participated in immersion experiences such as Veamer for a Day and the Marquee Event at Verizon's headquarters in Basking Ridge, New Jersey. These opportunities expanded my understanding of network operations at scale and provided direct exposure to executive leadership. My journey and career growth were later featured in Essence Magazine, highlighting the broader impact of these experiences on my path in tech."

What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"My most intentional career move has been positioning myself at the intersection of technology and impact. I strategically pursued internships across gaming, AI/ML research, and telecommunications to understand how technology is developed, scaled, and managed across industries. I've also invested in mentorship and maintained a strong professional presence so that opportunities align with preparation. I believe long term success comes from being both technically excellent and strategically visible."

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

"I'm shaping tomorrow by building technology that is both innovative and equitable. My research on algorithmic bias in AI hiring systems focuses on ensuring automated tools do not disadvantage minority candidates. While working on Google's Gemini AI team, I also conducted research on African American Vernacular English (AAVE), helping improve how natural language processing systems recognize and interpret diverse speech patterns to make AI more inclusive for all speakers. In addition, I mentor younger students in computer science, helping them navigate internships and career preparation so that more Black women feel confident entering and leading in tech spaces."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"Be intentional about your visibility, stay active on LinkedIn and network strategically because relationships open doors. Keep your resume updated so you're always prepared when opportunity meets timing. Pursue leadership roles early, even outside of tech, because communication, initiative, and ownership are just as important as technical skill. Most importantly, advocate for yourself boldly and consistently."





SARAH SLOAN

CLASS OF 2027

Sarah's journey from Glow Recipe to BET reflects a commitment to media and representation. A T. Howard & Emma Bowen Fellow, she uses TikTok and Substack to center Black female voices, proving that every "no" leads to a divine "yes."

What internship(s), fellowship(s), research experience(s), or career opportunities have you participated in (past or present)?

"Throughout my matriculation, I have served as a Digital Outreach Intern for Gifted Girls of Grace Inc. and participated in the Inaugural Emerging Dreamers Cohort in partnership with the Atlanta Dream and the King Center. During my sophomore year at Spelman College, I worked as a Glow Gang University Ambassador for Glow Recipe before joining BET as a Social Media Intern in New York City. I am now a proud member of the Emma Bowen Foundation Fellowship and T. Howard Foundation Final Talent Pool."

Have you traveled for any site visits, HBCU programs, company immersions, conferences, or career exposure experiences? If so, where and what was the impact?

"After my time as a BET Social Media Intern, I worked on set as a Social Producer for For the Fellas Season 2 and volunteered with the PR and community impact team for the Season 4 premiere of Zatima at the Silverspot Cinema in Atlanta, GA."



What has been your most intentional career prep move so far, and why?

"I think my most intentional career prep move has been joining organizations that amplify diversity in the entertainment and media industries, such as Emma Bowen and T. Howard. These spaces have not only supported my professional development but also allowed me to feel seen and valued in the PWI spaces I enter."

How are you shaping tomorrow through innovation, leadership, or impact?

"I believe the shaping of tomorrow begins with giving your all to the present day. As Spelmanites, it is imperative that we use our voices as advocates, scholars, and change agents, no matter the medium. I use platforms like TikTok and Substack to use my voice and contribute to the discourse in our society through a Black female lens."

What advice would you give another Spelman student about preparing for career success?

"I would tell a fellow Spelmanite to be grateful for the closed doors. Rejection is always a difficult force, and doesn't get easier, but the no's will continue to push you closer to where you are supposed to be. What is for you will never pass you by! Always look at smaller opportunities to build your resume and experience toward your career goals."

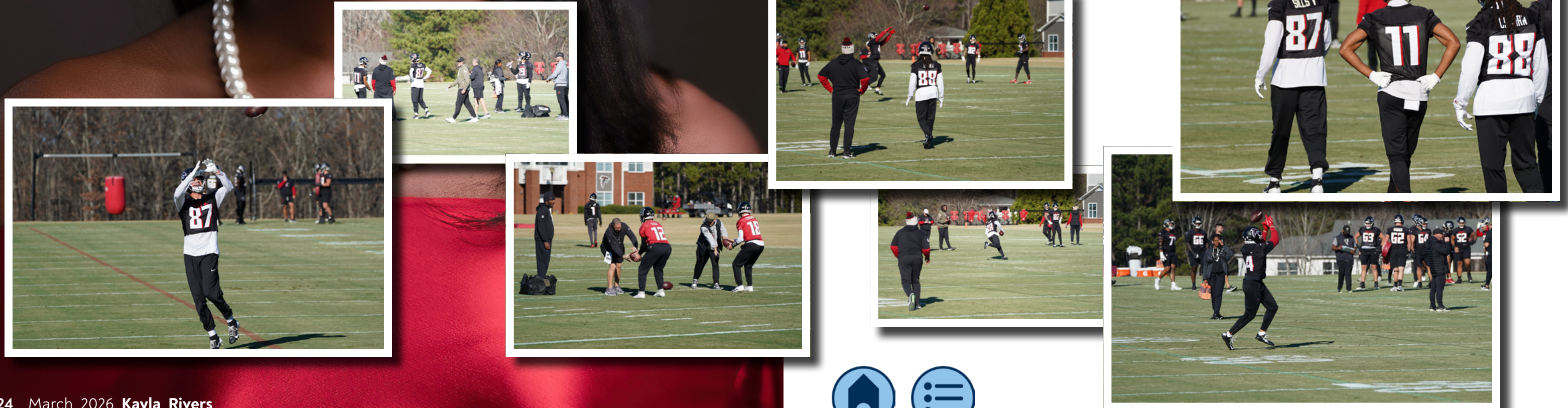

Aligning Your Student Life with Your Career Goals

Landing an internship isn't luck; it's a strategy.
You position yourself for it over time, with intention, and by making moves most students overlook. Here's your step-by-step blueprint.

FRESHMAN YEAR

- Visit your Career Planning & Development Center
- Create your LinkedIn—**your portfolio in progress**
- Attend 2–3 career events (just to observe and learn)
- Read emails about companies visiting campus and **add them to your calendar**
- Introduce yourself to at least one recruiter, speaker, or upperclassman
- Join organizations that align with your interest

Exposure over perfection

JUNIOR YEAR

- Apply early and consistently
- Attend career fairs with a **target list of companies**
- Research companies deeply (roles, culture, recruiters, programs)
- Request intentional coffee chats
- Attend **company trips, summits, and HBCU-focused programs**
- Use LinkedIn as a living portfolio

Strategy over Randomness

SOPHOMORE YEAR

- Go to career fairs and talk to recruiters
- Apply to internships—even if you don't meet all requirements
- Request coffee chats with alumni, professionals, and recruiters
- Participate in shadowing experiences or short-term programs
- Research companies before events

Action builds Confidence

SENIOR YEAR

- Reconnect with recruiters and professionals you've already met
- Apply to full-time roles and late-cycle internships
- Ask directly for referrals and insights
- Attend key events or sessions
- Keep LinkedIn polished, reflecting your journey
- Evaluate offers intentionall

What is First Destination?

FIRST DESTINATION tells the story of where our Spelmanites will begin their career or education journey after graduation.

Based on your submissions from your First Destination Survey, taken for the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), a video presentation is created to present at commencement.

Presentation Requirements

1. You must be participating in Spring 2026 commencement
2. Submit form with your next steps after graduation.
3. Provide a high resolution professional headshot/photo to the form (**please have the background removed in the photo if possible**)

NOTE: Information provided on the form will be vetted against your First Destination Survey response. False information may prevent your submission from being featured in the video.





Student leaders often help shape campus culture. How does SGA encourage students to think about their careers early and take advantage of networking and internship opportunities?

SGA actively encourages students to begin thinking about their careers early by taking advantage of networking and internship opportunities. Through partnerships with Career Planning and Development, such as our collaboration on the campus career fair, we ensure students feel both informed and supported. We also host initiatives like our headshot fair, equipping students with professional materials needed for internships, jobs, and graduate school applications. Importantly, we strive to expose students to a diverse range of career paths from law and medicine to the arts, recognizing the breadth of talent and interests within our student body. Not only do we bring graduate school recruiters to campus, but we also bring corporations to ensure that students receive the resources they need.



SGA has an upcoming event focused on careers and internships. What can students expect from this event, and how do you hope it will impact their professional journeys?

Looking ahead, our upcoming career-focused event will provide students with resume reviews, interview preparation, and direct engagement with professionals who can guide them along their journeys. We emphasize the importance of networking, often captured in the phrase “your net worth is your network,” and encourage students to build meaningful connections while also uplifting others, embodying Spelman’s commitment to sisterhood and collective success.

As student leaders navigating internships and career prep yourselves, what advice would you give other Spelman students about making the most of opportunities while on campus?

My advice to fellow Spelman students is simple: embrace every opportunity. Time at Spelman passes quickly, and it is essential to engage fully academically, professionally, and socially without regret.
