The Spelman College and UC Law San Francisco accelerated 3+3 program permits Spelman students who meet the 3+3 admission requirements to enter UC Law San Francisco after three years of undergraduate education.



Guaranteed Admission

For students who meet the UC Law San Francisco 25th percentile GPA and LSAT/GRE score from the prior admissions year



Guaranteed Scholarship

Minimum of \$15,000 per year for 3 years of full-time studies in good standing at UC Law San Francisco



California Scholars

Students who graduated from a California high school may also be eligible for our full-tuition scholarship California Scholars Program

Spelman undergraduate advisors will identify, mentor, and support students in their admission request. Staff at both Spelman and UC Law San Francisco are available to counsel students.

Years 1-3 (Spelman Tuition Rate)

- Declare interest in 3+3 during Year 1
- Work with Spelman Pre-Law Advisor on course selection
- Complete 75% of undergraduate coursework
- Meet Spelman's 3+3 requirement
- Sit for the LSAT or GRE (by Fall of Year 3)
- Apply to UC Law SF by March 1 of Year 3

Year 4 (UC Law SF Tuition Rate)

- Complete 31 credits of law coursework (28 credits will count towards both BA/BS and JD)
- BA/BS awarded from Spelman College upon successful completion of Year 4

Years 5-6 (UC Law SF Tuition Rate)

- Complete 55 credits of law coursework
- JD awarded by UC Hastings Law upon successful completion of Year 6

| 3+3 students pay the standard Spelman College tuition rate in years one to three. |

| 3+3 students are considered first-year law students once they enroll at UC Law San Francisco and pay UC Law San Francisco tuition rate and fees. |
| Beginning in year four, students are no longer eligible for undergraduate federal, state, or Spelman institutional financial aid. |
| 3+3 students receive a UC Law San Francisco merit scholarship of at least \$15,000 annually for each of their three years of law school as long as they maintain full-time student status and remain in good academic standing (GPA 2.5 and above). |
| Beginning in year four, students are eligible for federal loans for professional school students. |
| Spelman students who graduated from a California high school may also be eligible for the full-tuition + \$20,000 living stipend UC Law San Francisco California Scholars Program. |
