Faculty Mentor (FM) Instructions

Faculty Mentors (FM) should be familiar with a student's intellectual capacity, academic goals and achievements. Too, be familiar with the specific PFS in an effort to assist the student with the application process. FMs will help guide and support students throughout the application process (duties include: reviewing and editing personal statements/written work, and monitoring progress with application materials to ensure that deadlines are met).

FMs may or may not be one of the recommenders for the fellowship/scholarship opportunity for which they are assisting. If you do not write a letter of recommendation, you must provide a nomination statement in support of the student's application(s). Your nomination statement should not exceed one page and will be incorporated as part of the institution's nomination letter should the applicant be advanced. Please use the form on page 2.

Recommenders are not required to provider a nomination statement but we welcome the additional input to craft a string and thorough institutional nomination letter.

Nomination Instructions:

The nomination statement should provide an overview of the applicant while drawing our attention to particular areas of interest relevant to the fellowship/scholarship opportunity. This statement helps introduce us, and the granting institution, to the candidate and their passions and interests. It need not detail everything in the application, but rather help to pull together the various threads of the application – academics, leadership, service and career goals - into a cohesive whole.

Nomination Statement:
